County have devised sold and conveyed unto said claimant and do by these  
presents for ourselves our heirs and assigns justly and absolutely remise release  
and give from said claim unto the said Alfonso Melton his heirs and  
assigns forever all such right and title as to the said tract and wife  
then or ought to have in or to a certain lot situated in said village formerly  
belonging to John Suggs deceased the father of said lady which lot is bounded  
north by the Gin Canal South of main Street East by lot of George S. Houch  
together with all or right title and interest to a certain legacy due to the  
lady to said lady by the will of said John Suggs deceased To have and  
to hold the premises unto him the said Alfonso Melton his heirs and assigns  
to the only use and behoof of the said Alfonso Melton his heirs and assigns  
from and to what matter we the said Nicholas S. Smith his wife or any other  
person in our own and behoof shall or will hereafter claim or demand any  
right or title to the premises or any part thereof but they and any of them  
shall by these presents be excluded and forever barred In witness whereof

and purpose therein expressed - J. Melton Esq. Clerk - Commissioner -  
State of Maryland On this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1846 personally appeared  
George County of Virginia the Hon. James Smith one of the Justices of the  
Court of Common Pleas of said County the above named lady  
South County to the person described in and who executed the above con-  
veyance and acknowledged the same to be his free and voluntary act and deed  
for the purpose therein expressed and who declared that he had no objection  
and without any coercion or other force or undue influence or other  
fraud or undue influence on the part of the said husband - Witness my  
hand at Williamsburg this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1846 at said Williamsburg  
George County of Virginia the Hon. James Smith one of the Justices of the Court of Common  
Pleas of said County of Virginia do hereby certify the Hon. James Smith Esq.

 have granted, sold and given quit Claim and of these presents do hereby  
 release and forever quit Claim unto Nathaniel Weston and to his heirs and assigns  
 your certain right title and interest of us and to that certain lot situate in  
 said City of New York bounded by the Erie Canal, South by Main Street East by  
 a lot formerly owned by Geo. Pluch and now owned by Charles Eckhardt  
 together with all the rights of title and interest to a certain legacy due to the  
 said Weston the wife of the deceased Nathaniel Weston and the wife of the said  
 John Livingston deceased and assigns of and to said Nathaniel Weston and his heirs  
 (residue) to have and to hold the said right title and interest unto the said Nathaniel  
 Weston and the wife of said deceased with the said Nathaniel Weston his heirs and  
 assigns to their own proper use and behoof forever. In testimony whereof the  
 said Nathaniel Weston and I have hereunto set our hands  
 and seals this third day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 eight hundred and thirty five.
