Stouterburgh Esquire, Surrogate of our said County, the last will and testament of Benjamin Cheadle deceased (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) was proved, and is now approved and allowed of by us; and the said deceased having whilst he lived, and at the time of his death, goods, chattels or credits, within this State, by means whereof the proving and settling the said will, and granting administration, of all and singular the said goods, chattels and credits, and also the auditing allowing, and final discharging the account thereof, doth belong unto us. The administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, and any way concerning his wife, is granted unto Elizale Cheadle an executor, in the said will named, being first duly sworn well and faithfully to administer the same, and to make and exhibit a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the said goods, chattels and credits, and also to render a just and true account thereof, when thereunto required.
